TWBS Teachers' Swimathon

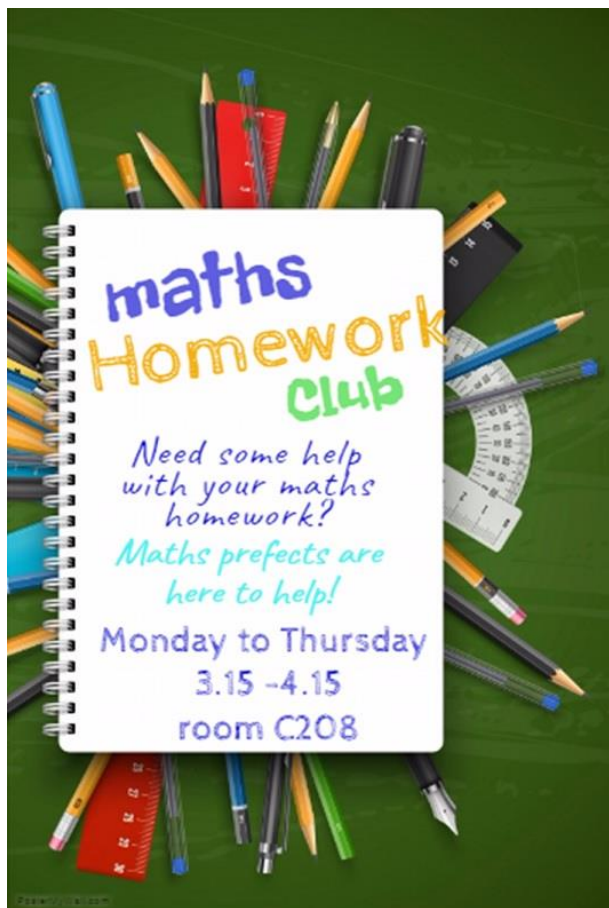

A Message from Thames Valley Police on the importance of reporting crime!

We at Thames Valley Police can not underestimate the importance of reporting incidents and crimes when they occur. It is an essential part of the policing process that allows officers to keep the community safe and to resolve situations and/or action investigations in a timely fashion.

You can report incidents in two ways. The first option, in case of an emergency, is to call **999**. This will allow you to speak directly to an operator straight away who will take down the details of the crime and will dispatch officers. The second is to report via the non-emergency number on **101**. This will be for any incident that doesn't require an immediate response.

Should the incident or crime involve a student or students at The Windsor Boys' School and occur outside of school hours then we would recommend that, in the first instance, you report it to Thames Valley Police on either of the aforementioned numbers and then notify the school when they are open.
